

**Rules to be followed by film-makers
when filming in the KL Plaszow Museum**

Prior written consent of the KL Plaszow Museum is required to make documentaries or TV programmes at the KL Plaszow Memorial Site.

1. The content of the filmed material must not in any way tarnish the good name of the KL Plaszow victims and former prisoners, their families, or the KL Plaszow Museum itself.
2. The KL Plaszow Museum must be notified in advance of any film-making plans concerning the Memorial Site, via email sent to: info@plaszow.org.
3. A request for permission to film at the KL Plaszow Museum site must be accompanied by the script or the fragment of the script to be filmed at the Memorial Site.
4. Any filming activity is subject to a fee of PLN 1000.00 filming day (8 hours), payable to the Museum's bank account.
5. A fee exemption may be granted by the KL Plaszow Museum upon request.
6. The information that the material has been filmed at the KL Plaszow Museum site must be included in the film credits.
7. The Museum shall be entitled to receive one gratuitous copy of the completed film, along with the right to use the same for its statutory purposes.
8. The producers shall be liable for any damage caused during filming, resulting from the activities of the film crew or third parties engaged by them.

The KL Plaszow Memorial Site covers the area of the former Nazi concentration camp KL Plaszow. The site is listed and has the status of a war cemetery – it includes two Jewish cemeteries and three mass graves. The KL Plaszow Memorial Museum is the official caretaker of the site.

1. The KL Plaszow Museum is an open-access, unguarded, soft-landscaped area. It is visited by tourists and Krakow residents as well as animals. The Museum is not liable for any inconvenience while making a film or TV programme, consequent upon this

fact.

2. The area of the former concentration camp is a historic site, with varied topography and accessibility. Hence, prior to filming or photographing a reconnaissance visit or guided tour is recommended.
3. Walkers are recommended to move only along marked routes and roads, and in the area of the former roll-call square, particularly in adverse weather conditions.
4. Special attention should be paid on steep climbs, escarpments, and precipices.
5. There are no toilets or access to any other utilities (water, electricity, etc.) in the Memorial Museum area.

It is strictly forbidden to:

1. Access the site by vehicles over 3.5 tonnes;
2. Set up any equipment, installations, permanently fixed object, or anything that may affect or impact the surroundings, including sound amplification equipment or any other equipment generating noise, power generators, intensive lighting, etc.;
3. Interfere in any way with the ground, including digging, removing layers of soil, or fixing poles, stands ,or jibs that need to be anchored at a depth exceeding 20 cm;
4. Take anything from the site (historic objects, plants, stones, etc.);
5. Damage the greenery, including trimming or otherwise modifying the vegetation, banding, breaking, picking up flowers or fruit, etc.;
6. Scare wild animals;
7. Enter drifts and other former quarry sites and caves that can be found in the former camp area;
8. Make additional signs, writings, orientation marks in the historic site;
9. Set up stage elements;
10. Reconstruct historical events.
